Tried logging on using the ingame menu, but it came up with "invalid serial" error. I have CnC The First Decade.

Tried to delete the WOLdata.key as suggested in another forum but now I get a "RenGuard error".

Before you ask, no I haven't shared my key with anyone else and yes it is a valid key.

I found a "Workaround" but it's quite annoying.

- 1) Have the WOLdata.key in the game dir.
- 2) Start up the game, RenGuard should pop up as normal.
- 3) Once it's fully loaded, go to the game dir and cut the WOLdata.key and paste it to another directory.
- 4) Click "Renegade" on the RenGuard window and play normally.

Seems to work, I can connect not a problem and use RenGuard as well.

Posted this problem at strike-team.net and they suggested to me I should try posting here as well.

Please help!
