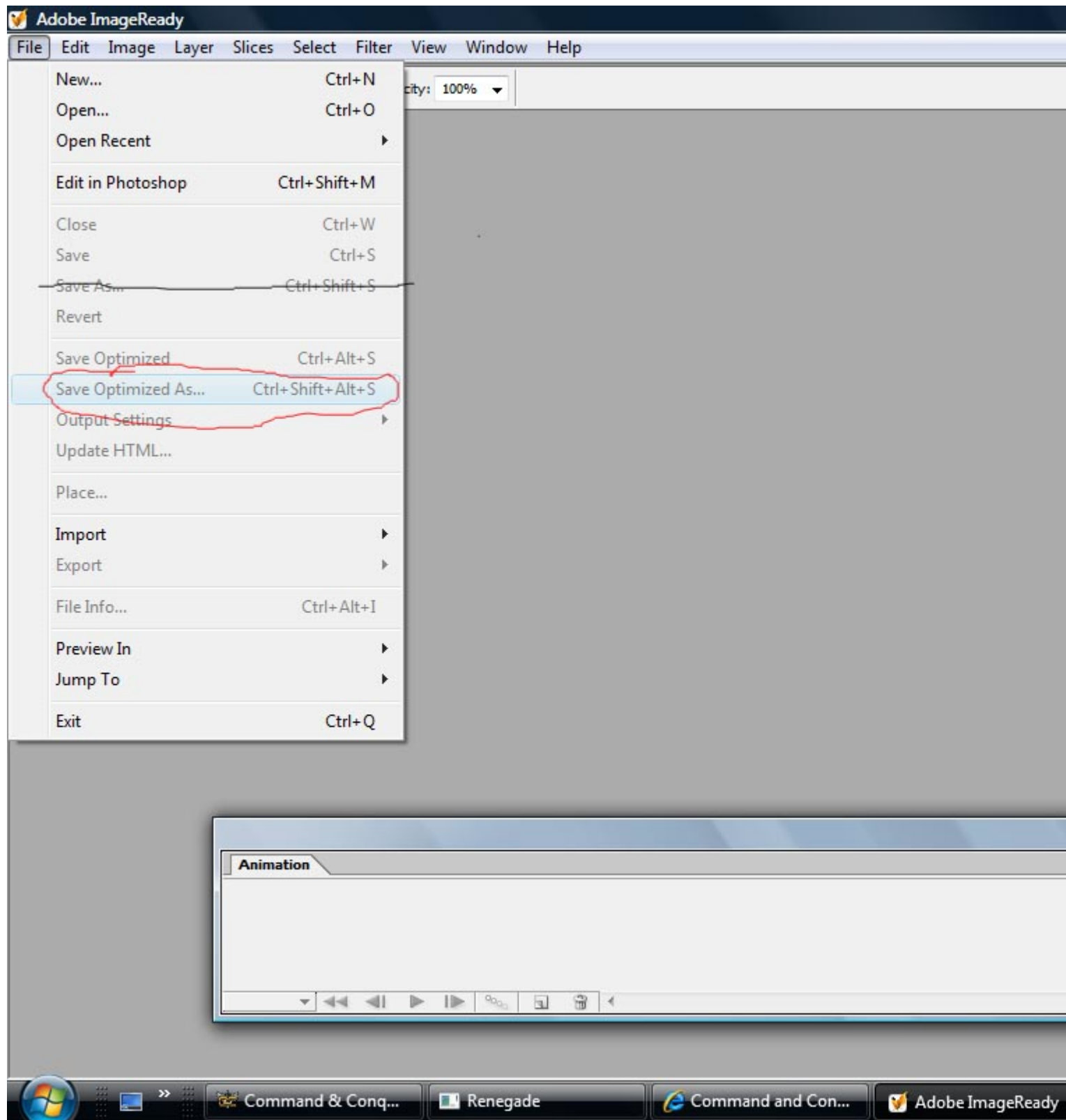
What I was talking about is it needs to be saved with the "save optimized as" option, instead of the regular "save as".
